Lake Nona Property Holdings Inc., owned by the family of Joe Lewis, a prominent retired British industrialist, paid \$11.12 million to

Carter Land Trust Inc. for a 1,000-acre tract along the southeast-

ern boundary of the existing 6,735acre Lake Nona mixed-use development in south Orange County.

The price in the all-cash June 4 deal equates to \$11,120 per acre, or 26 cents per square foot.

Lake Nona Property Holdings bought the 15-year-old Lake Nona development on March 7, 1996, from the original owners/developers, John Sunley and John Fryer of London-based Sunley Holdings PLC, for \$28 million.

That price equates to \$4,157 per acre, or $9^{1}/2$ cents per square foot. Of the 6,735 acres, 4,900 acres are developable. The balance is designated as wetlands.

The amount of wetlands in Lake Nona Property's newest acquisition hasn't been totally calculated. The property's gross acreage is now 7,735 acres.


Sunley Holdings paid \$35 million for the existing 6,735-acre tract in 1983. That price equates to \$6,422 per acre, or 14.7 cents per square foot.

Lake Nona Property Holdings is headed by Vivienne Silverton, daugh-

ter of Joe Lewis.

Vivienne Silverton also is a vice president in Aviva Land Holdings Inc., which owns the 800-acre Isleworth Golf Course and Country Club community in Windermere. Her husband, Toby Silverton, is Aviva's president.
